Information for Parents/Guardians

Primary 1 to 5 After School Programme (ASP)

After School Programme (ASP) for P1 to P5 students are conducted to provide additional support to different groups of students. The subject teachers will select students based on areas in which they need additional support. Targeted guidance and additional practice will be provided in these areas to bridge these learning gaps to achieve proficiency in the subject area.

For Term 3, ASP for P1 to P5 students will commence in Week 3. Subject teachers will issue consent forms to students who are selected for the ASP.

Primary 6 Focused Revision Programme (FRP)

Focused Revision Programme (FRP) is conducted for selected Primary 6 students as part of the school's effort to support the students' learning in preparation for PSLE. FRP will be taking place on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, starting from Thursday, Week 2 of Term 3. The subject teachers will select students based on areas of needs of the students to provide additional support or to extend their learning. It provides the opportunity for the students to review and consolidate their learning and effectively prepare for their examination and improve their overall performance.

Subject teachers will send out the consent forms via PG to parents/guardians of students who are selected for the FRP.

School Uniforms

Students must wear the official school uniform without any modifications. Track pants are not part of the standard uniform. However, students with medical conditions requiring them to wear track pants may request for special permission. To apply for this exception, please e-mail the Principal. Attendance and Temperature-taking Exercise

The Attendance and Temperature-Taking Exercise (ATTEx) is conducted twice yearly to maintain our school's readiness for health emergencies and to teach students the importance of personal and social responsibility for their health.

The Semester 2 ATTEx will be held on Wednesday, 9 July (Term 3 Week 2). A familiarisation exercise will take place on Friday, 4 July, during which Form Teachers will check students' thermometers.

For both the ATTEx and Familiarisation Exercise, students must bring their working oral digital thermometer (ODT). Under their Form Teacher's supervision, students will take and record their temperature readings in their Student Companion.

Please ensure your child has a working ODT and brings it to school daily. Students should take their temperature before school when feeling unwell or during disease outbreaks. Form Teachers will conduct random checks of students' ODTs. If your child's/ward's thermometer is faulty, please replace it promptly. Remember to check batteries regularly and replace them as needed. New thermometers are available at the school bookshop for approximately \$5.50.

Health Matters

Should your child/ward be unwell, please keep him/her at home to rest and recover fully. This is necessary to ensure your child's/ward's well-being as well as to minimise the risk of transmitting contagious illnesses to the school community. Thank you for working with us in playing a crucial role in safeguarding the health of our school community.

Healthy Eating Habits

To promote healthy eating habits and lifestyle choices, we encourage students to have regular meals and nutritious snacks during their time at school. This initiative aims to ensure students maintain a healthy lifestyle. We seek parents'/guardians' support in emphasising to your child/ward the importance of selecting balanced meals from the canteen, specifically to incorporate vegetables and fruits.

Dismissal and After-School Safety

During rain or lightning alerts, parents/guardians may enter the school compound to wait for their children. Students will be dismissed from Gate 1, which provides sheltered access via a covered linkway to the bus stop across the road.

We also urge parents/guardians to monitor your child's/ward's whereabouts before and after school to ensure their safety and proper behaviour. Students should return home directly after school and not loiter in the neighbourhood.



Traffic Matters

Drop-offs in the morning: Please drop off your child/ward at the school foyer rather than along the roadside outside the school. Roadside drop-offs cause traffic congestion and create safety hazards for all road users. Do remember to display the school car decal prominently for identification when entering the school. Pick-ups after school dismissal: Stopping in the yellow box outside Gate 1 or making U-turns is a traffic violation. Please use the HDB car park opposite the school and walk to the gate to pick up your child/ward. This arrangement ensures everyone's safety.

Foyer pick-ups: During inclement weather, parents/guardians may pick up your child/ward from the school foyer before 2pm. For security reasons, vehicle entry into the school compound is not permitted after 2pm.

School Bus

Should your child/ward be taking the school bus, please reinforce these safety rules with him/her:

- Maintain silence during the journey to avoid distracting the driver
- Stay seated throughout the ride
- Obey the instructions given by the bus driver and the attendant
