Home-School Partnership

Let us partner one another to inculcate the value of responsibility and confidence in our children.

Responsibility - Students should be taught to pack their bags and bring required items to school. As such, parents should not be expected to bring items that our students have forgotten to school. If they have forgotten to bring their items, let's not be in hurry to "save" them and solve the problem for them. On the contrary let's teach them to bear the consequences of the forgotten items, so that they will learn not to repeat this mistake – a safe way for our students to learn about responsibility! That said, should you still wish to drop off any items, items that are handed over to the school will **not** be delivered to the students but placed in the General Office. Students may collect them either during recess or after school.

We would also like to remind parents to encourage your children to promptly claim any lost money or valuable items, such as wallets and watches, from the General Office. Such items will be kept for a limited period to facilitate identification and collection. In accordance with MOE guidelines, if these items remain unclaimed by the end of the month, unclaimed money will be deposited into the MOE account, and unclaimed items will either be disposed of or donated.

Confidence - Recess is a precious time for our students, a chance to eat, play, and build the friendships that make school a joyful and meaningful experience. Some students are using this time to make casual phone calls to their loved ones. Frequent check-ins can inadvertently reinforce separation anxiety and make it harder for students to develop the confidence to navigate their school day on their own. To support this, students have been reminded that phones are to be used only for urgent calls during school hours. We ask that you reinforce this message at home so that together we can help our children grow into confident and independent individuals who are well-prepared for the journey ahead.
