- Being Active: Fun family movement (walks, play) for at least 1 hour daily.
- Eating Healthy: Involving children in preparing enjoyable nutritious meals.
- Sleeping Well: Consistent calming bedtime routines.
- Screen Use: Prioritising device-free family time (meals, outings).
- Building Bonds & Resilience: Everyday chats to strengthen connections and manage stress.

As children grow, gradually stepping back helps build their independence. Allowing small choices — what to eat and play during recess, speaking up, handling responsibilities — fosters self-agency and resilience. As one parent reflected, preparing for school milestones is often more about parents learning to let go than over-preparing the child. Embracing small “bumps and scrapes” nurtures capable, confident learners. These consistent practices support wellness and align with our N.I.C.E. culture. The school will reinforce them through lessons and programmes throughout the term.

Thank you for your continued partnership. Together, we nurture kind, resilient, and capable learners.

## **Information for Parents and Guardians**

### **P2 to P6 After School Programme (ASP)**

ASP is designed to provide targeted support to address specific learning gaps and build greater confidence and competence in your child's learning.

For Term 2, After School Programme Lessons (ASP) for selected P3 to P6 students will commence on Tuesday, 24 March 2026. The selected students would have already been informed by the Heads of Department via PG.

### **Hari Raya Celebrations**

Our school will be celebrating Hari Raya Aidilfitri on Wednesday, 25 March 2026. The school will follow the normal timetable on that day. As students will be seated in the school hall for the concert segment of the celebration, wearing the school uniform will ensure their comfort and ease of movement. All students, except those performing in the concert, are to report to school in their school uniform.

As a school, we value the rich cultural traditions within our community and recognize the significance of Hari Raya, alongside other major festive celebrations such as Chinese New Year and Deepavali. At the same time, we remain centered on learning, ensuring that students continue to be focused and ready to participate meaningfully in the Hari Raya activities that the school has thoughtfully prepared for them.

### **P1 & P2 Literacy Programme for Selected Students**

This programme seeks to develop foundational literacy in P1 and P2 selected students by strengthening their phonics, accurate letter-sound correspondence, word recognition, and mastery of high-frequency sight words.

The programme will commence on Monday, 30 March 2026 for P2 and Tuesday, 31 March 2026 for P1. The **selected** students have been informed by their respective teachers at the end of Term 1.

### **Mother Tongue Languages (MTL) Fortnight**

MTL Fortnight will be held in Term 2 Weeks 2 and 3 for P1 to P5 students. The activities provide authentic opportunities for our students to actively learn their Mother Tongue Languages and experience different cultural practices.

### **Co-curricular Activities (CCA)**

All CCAs will commence in Term 2 Week 2. The National School Games Senior Division will continue in Term 2. The Junior Division Games will commence in the later part of Term 2 and continue throughout Term 3. We will provide more details for the students who are selected to represent the school at a later date.

P6 students will stand down from their CCA at the end of April. We would like to thank our P6 students for their contributions to their respective CCAs.

### **2026 Student Leaders' Investiture**

The Student Leaders' Investiture will be held in school on Wednesday, 8 April 2026, from 7.40 a.m. to 8.30 a.m.

This year, we will be appointing P4 Tier 2 Leaders — Care Leaders, CCA Leaders, Environment Leaders, ICT Leaders, Innovation Leaders, Prefects, and Reading Leaders. These students will be formally inducted into their respective roles during the ceremony.

We will also be appointing the P5 Tier 3 Leaders, together with the newly appointed Head and Assistant Head Prefects.

Each newly appointed leader may invite two guests to witness the ceremony. Invitations are sent via PG notification. An e-copy of the appointment letter, indicating the role your child/ward has been selected for, will be provided via student's email after the ceremony.

### **International Friendship Day (IFD)**

CCKPS will be commemorating International Friendship Day on Wednesday, 15 April 2026. The theme for this year is '**Forging friendships in a Complex World**'. There will assembly programme and recess activities.

The objective of IFD is to prepare our students to:

1. Understand our region and the world.

  - Be acquainted with the diverse and colourful culture and traditions of the region and the lives of their peers in other ASEAN countries.
2. Foster people-to-people international friendships.

  - Express appreciation for foreigners living, working, and studying in Singapore.

### **Book Character Parade**

Book Character Parade for P1 to P4 will be held on Wednesday, 6 May 2026.

The objective of the event is to promote a strong reading culture in the school. We hope to encourage and sustain a love for reading in our students through this exciting event.

We invite all students to take part in this event and spread the joy of reading. We look forward to seeing our students dressed as vibrant literary characters on that day!

### **Enrichment & Innovation Day**

The school will be conducting our termly Enrichment & Innovation (E&I) Days on Tuesday, 26 May and Thursday, 28 May 2026 in Term 2. All students will participate in a variety of specially curated programmes designed to broaden their experiences beyond the classroom. Activities include high-energy fitness sessions like Jump Jam, hands-on Science programmes, and learning journeys.
